CHARLOTTE BARKLA: Crafting Great Characters (Writer's Workshop)

Great characters are the backbone of great stories. In this workshop, Charlotte will guide students through a series of interactive exercises to develop their own believable, flawed, unique characters, that will propel their story forward.



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
